DIVE INSTRUCTOR

As a diving Instructor, it's your role to share your love of the ocean and your enthusiasm for the marine world in a safe and professional way. As a technically skilled diver, it's your job to communicate your knowledge in a fun and creative way. Sharing your knowledge and expertise with your students ensures they come away from their experience satisfied after an enjoyable experience and with new confidence and skills. The job is multi faceted and if you're not instructing you may be guiding, filling tanks, maintaining equipment or working on a boat. Opportunities in the tourist industry are growing at all levels, whether on super yachts, at a luxury resort, cruise ship or here in New Zealand. With the new developments in technical diving the chance to learn new Instructor specialties are growing all the time.

UNDERWATER PHOTOGRAPHER/ VIDEOGRAPHER

As well as being a skilled diver and good with people, this is the creative aspect of the Industry. Technology is changing all the time and as an underwater videographer or photographer, you may be working with people, in a commercial diving role or with marine wildlife.

DIVE RETAIL MANAGER

Selling is a skill and a good retail manager must understand customers' needs. Potential customers want up to date information on the new technologies and developments in a rapidly changing and evolving Scuba equipment market. More often than not customers want to know what you dive with, what's your preference of brand or type of equipment? Having an in depth knowledge of all dive courses helps assisting them with the right equipment for them personally. COMMERCIAL DIVER

Another benefit of doing your instructor course is that you can instruct in between commercial jobs and get the best of both worlds!

NEW ZEALAND CERTIFICATE IN DIVING RESCUE Level 3 Qualification



Qualification Overview

Rescue level 3 at Auckland Scuba takes you from a beginner diver through to your PADI Rescue Diver certification.


This course is perfect if you want to start your diving journey, or if you need an Occupational Diving Certificate of Competence (CoC) from Worksafe NZ (e.g: scientific divers). On completion, you will be a confident diver with over 40 logged dives. You also have the opportunity to claim 40 NCEA credits at level 3.

This qualification comprises mainly practical training with some dive theory. We offer part-time and full-time course options. Our full-time summer school (November - February) is particularly popular with students.

With class sizes around 8 people, Auckland Scuba's exceptional tutors are able to work with you closely to help build your self confidence and reach mastery during skill practise.

Your studies will start by taking you through the beginner's course, where you will learn the basic skills of diving and explore the underwater world for the first time. Following this, you will start adventure based diving activities such as deep, boat, night, navigation, peak performance buoyancy, search and recovery, and more. As you explore these different areas in diving, you will complete the first dive of each specialty, allowing you to gain a broad skill base. After this, you'll move onto the Emergency First Responder and Rescue Diver course, which promises to be one of the most enjoyable parts of your diving experience! Here, you will learn how to handle an emergency situation (e.g: panicked divers, unconscious divers). You will provide in-water assistance and First Aid.

Once certified as a Rescue Diver, you have met the requirements to apply for your Certificate of Competence (CoC) from WorkSafe in categories such as Scientific diver, Aquaculture, Tourism, Film and Photography. If you find your passion in diving and want to continue your career in this industry, there are also pathways allowing you to progress to a professional Dive Master and/or a Dive Instructor. NEW ZEALAND CERTIFICATE IN DIVING (SUPERVISION) Level 4 Qualification



Qualification Overview

Supervision level 4 at Auckland Scuba takes you from a Rescue Diver through to your Divemaster and Master Scuba Diver certifications.

This course is perfect if you want to enter the professional realm of diving. On completion, you will have the most popular and most recognized professional scuba certification in the world, along with with 5 specialties. PADI Divemasters enjoy abundant career opportunities, get paid to scuba dive and share their love for the ocean. As well as this, you will be certified as a Master Scuba Diver. This rating places you in an elite group of respected divers who have earned this rating through both significant experience and scuba training.

Prerequisites for this course are as follows: 18 years old; PADI Rescue Diver certification (or qualifying certification); completion of Emergency First Response - Primary and Secondary Care training (or qualifying training) within 24 months; minimum 30 logged dives; medically evaluated and cleared for diving by a physician within 12 months.

Your studies will start by taking you through the PADI

Divemaster program, where you will learn how to; lead underwater tours, assist with scuba classes, give an in-depth dive briefing, conduct refresher training, and inspire others to care about the ocean. Following this, you will complete the training for 5 recreational specialties of your choosing. Some specialties that are available at Auckland Scuba include; Enriched Air/Nitrox, Sidemount Diver, Full Face Mask, Emergency Oxygen Provider, Diver Propulsion Vehicle, Night Diver, Drift Diver, Deep Diver, Wreck Diver, Underwater Photography, plus many more. Once completed, you will be certified as a Master Scuba Diver. Alongside this practical work, you will also cover theory topics such as physics, physiology, equipment, environment, and RDP in more detail.

With class sizes around 8 people, Auckland Scuba's exceptional tutors are able to work with you closely to help build your self confidence and reach mastery during skill practise.

Once certified as a PADI Divemaster, you will be able to mentor other divers and conduct Discover Local Diving and ReActivate programs. In addition to this, you can become qualified to teach select PADI specialty courses. This includes PADI Mermaid™, PADI Freediver™, Emergency First Response® first aid and CPR courses.

If you want to progress in professional diving, there is a pathway allowing you to become an Assistant Instructor and/or a Dive Instructor. See the following pages for more information (pg.11-13).

DIPLOMA IN PROFESSIONAL SCUBA INSTRUCTION Level 5 Qualification

Qualification Overview

Through theory and applied skills, The Diploma in Professional Scuba Instruction (DIPSI) at Auckland Scuba takes you from beginner diver through to PADI Specialty Instructor.

If you enjoy working with people and want to graduate with practical and transferable skills, then this is the course for you. On completion of the DIPSI course you will be proficient in leadership procedures, critical thinking, problem solving and be a confident communicator. Auckland Scuba's exceptional tutors will guide you in building your self confidence. Upon completion of the course you will be a fully trained PADI Scuba Instructor and a First Aid Instructor. You will graduate either ready to enter the workforce, or fully prepared to further your learning potential in the next phase of your career development, here in NZ or Overseas.

Your studies will start by taking you through the beginner's course where you explore the underwater world for the first time. You will then participate in adventure based diving activities such as deep, boat, night, navigation, search and recovery many more. You will then progress through to Rescue Diver, which is one of the most fun parts

of the course! You then proceed to your PADI Divemaster training. This is where you really begin to acquire dive leadership qualities, expanding your knowledge to a professional level. You will enhance your dive knowledge by training to supervise diving activities and your expertise will develop further, by assisting with new divers in training. You really start to think at a professional level, when you reach Divemaster status. Once you qualify as a Divemaster you will then complete the Instructor Development Course. Here you will learn how to teach everything up to and including Divemaster.

After successfully completing a PADI Instructor Examination you will become a PADI Open Water Scuba Instructor and go on to earn 5 Instructor Specialty ratings. Auckland Scuba, offer the most popular PADI specialties: Wreck, Deep, O2 provider, Navigation and Nitrox (at an additional charge). We also have a huge range of specialty instructor ratings you can gain to make you more employable which incur a small charge. Again, this means as an Auckland Scuba DIPSI graduate, you'll be more employable with these teaching specialties.

We also offer a student rate on Technical and Rebreather programs. With these extra qualifications you will go into the diving industry with a wider understanding of all different types of diving and a more rounded diving education. Dive shops will pick you over other candidates with less experience in these areas.

Sample Schedule & Padi Qualifications

PART 1

PADI OPEN WATER DIVER

If you've never dived before this will be your first taste of the underwater world. You will learn the essential skills needed to dive safely. This is when you get to know all your fellow students and 'buddies' For the first 3 weeks it's just dive, dive, dive. You will be certified to dive with a buddy to a max depth of 18m, without an instructor.

PADI ADVANCED OPEN WATER DIVER

You will complete 5 adventure dives and build your confidence and be very comfortable in the water by now. This is when you really start to experience your true diving adventures. You get to try underwater navigation, boat, night dive, search and recovery, underwater naturalist and deep. On completion you will be certified to dive to a maximum depth of 30m.

BASIC FIRST AID

Learn how to provide basic first aid for life threatening conditions. Learn common first aid conditions and how to respond to them.

PADI RESCUE DIVER

This is a real turning point in the course for many students. This is when you start to think like an instructor and are aware of fellow divers and buddies. Learn to deal with everything from a minor cramp in your leg to responding to an unconscious, non-breathing diver underwater. You will always be a welcome addition to any dive trip, with the knowledge you have gained so far.

TRIP 1 - WAIKATO RIVER DRIFT & TAUPO DIVES

Have fun while you learn. Our trip to Lake Taupo and the Waikato River drift dive are often quoted as one of the highlights of the DIPSI course. A great time away, accommodation and transport included - 4 days.

PART 2

PADI DIVE MASTER

Refine your diving skills, whilst learning more about the theory of diving. Study about the physics, physiology of diving and how scuba equipment works. This will be your chance to gain valuable experience supervising students under the guidance of a PADI instructor.

TRIP 2 - RAINBOW WARRIOR & CAVALLIS ISLANDS

Dive the famous Rainbow Warrior, Greenpeace's boat sunk by the French in 1985, and the Cavalli Islands. - Accommodation and transport included - 3 days.

TRIP 3 - HMNZS CANTERBURY & HMNZS WAIKATO WRECKS

Dive the HMNZ Canterbury and HMNZ Waikato. Accommodation and transport included - 4 days.

PART 3

PADI OPEN WATER SCUBA INSTRUCTOR

Develop your teaching skills in the classroom, pool and open water. After becoming an Open Water Scuba Instructor you will be able to teach the entire range of PADI programmes from Discover Scuba up to Divemaster. You can obtain work in over 180 countries and territories worldwide.

PADI EMERGENCY FIRST RESPONSE INSTRUCTOR (FIRST AID)

You will learn to teach skills based on internationally recognised emergency care guidelines, and you can offer courses to anyone

TRIP 4 - HMNZS WAIKATO WRECK & TUTUKAKA COAST

Dive the HMNZ Waikato and Tutukaka Coast. Accommodation and transport included. - 2 days.

SPECIALTY INSTRUCTOR

Become a specialist. Be trained by a PADI Course Director and improve your employment possibilities and add to your skill set. This is a chance to choose an area of expertise that really interests you and you are passionate about. Whether you want to further your teaching proficiency in the ever increasingly popular technical diving sector, photography, ice diving, or deep diving. You will be able to share your enthusiasm and knowledge with your future students.

TRIP 5 - POOR KNIGHTS ISLANDS - GRADUATION TRIP

Finish your course with a trip at the world famous Poor Knights. A marine reserve teeming with spectacular underwater life. 2 days

We have a 200m² retail store with two floors displaying a large range of premium international brands. Our experienced staff are available 7 days a week in store to discuss your gear requirements.


In addition, we have a large 200m² warehouse area for all student, Instructor and rental equipment to be stored securely. Your equipment can be stored for the duration of your course (so you will not have to lug your gear home every night). Also, as the area is spacious to have plenty of room to store your gear so it remains well maintained.



Classrooms & Student Areas

The classrooms are in a separate area on the second floor above the retail shop. There are two large air-conditioned classrooms. Both rooms are able to spaciouly accommodate 12 students and have complete teaching and presentation equipment.

Wifi is available for all students throughout the building for cell phone and computer use during you time with us. Students and staff have access to a kitchen/common area on the same floor. Outside is a common area with covered bench seating. Across the road we have cafes and food outlets for great coffee and a selection of food.




Location Transport & Facilities

Location

Located in Albany on the North Shore of Auckland, we have easy access to the region's top dive sites which are situated north of Auckland. The benefit of our location is that we get to the dive sites early. This means more time in the water gaining valuable experience and less time sitting in traffic. Our return journey is to the dive centre is also smooth so that we get you back in good time. See page 22 for more information on our dive sites.

Currently the northern bus lane is being worked on and we are going to be fortunate enough to have a bus depot on Arrenway Drive. This would be a 7 min walk (600m) away if you use public transport.



Transport

All transport to and from the dive sites is included in your course. So you just have to get to Auckland Scuba each day. We have two large vans that seat 12 people in comfort and with ample space to store your personal belongings. We also have two trailers to transport all the dive equipment.



On Site Facilities Available

In our facility we have one large twin compressor & storage bank system that can quickly fill the 70+ cylinders that we have on site. We are also regularly checked by Air Purity to ensure top quality air for diving.

During your training you will have the opportunity to do Nitrox/Enriched air specialty. Students that complete this course will have access to diving Nitrox/Enriched air for their selected dives to give them more time underwater.

If you are looking to go down the technical route at a later time we also have Tec Instructors on site and the ability to fill 100% O₂ as well as Helium on site. (Additional training required speak to us if your interested)

We have a fully equipped service center that can service all your diving equipment regardless of brand. If any of your equipment is having issues our staff can fix this on site and get you working as soon as possible.

If you are looking to go down the technical route we have Tec Instructors on site and offer courses to extend your recreational dive limits using twin sets, sidemount, mixed gases and closed circuit rebreathers. We also offer courses to use full face mask and underwater scooters. Additional training is required for these, however, we offer our students a special rate. Taking advantage of this extra training will enhance your skills as well as your potential employment opportunities.

Auckland Scuba Our Own Dive Boat



We have a customised 9m rigid inflatable boat powered with twin Evinrude HD 200hp engines to take you to some of NZ's best dive sites. The captain has years of experience working on boats all over the world to ensure you have a safe trip!



Auckland Scuba Field Trips

You will go on 5 awesome field trips during your Diploma Course. This will extend your diving experience as you explore some of NZ's best dive sites.



Extra Boat Dive Opportunities

At least 25% of your required dives will be from our customised dive boat.

In addition to the field trips, we offer opportunities to get some extra boat dives done outside of the course. These are free of charge and you can practise your dive leadership skills with real customers so that you can be even more ready for your career in diving.

Auckland Scuba Local Dive Sites

Most of Auckland's top dive sites are located just north of Auckland and within an easy drive of our North Shore facility. This means that we get into the water quicker and can spend longer training you (which is much more valuable than sitting in traffic).

Also, as we are based towards the North of New Zealand, we have warmer waters. The temperatures range from 14°C in the winter to 21°C in the summer. This means that you can stay underwater for longer and therefore get more real value from each dive.

What's more, we offer 120+ dives in our Diploma programme (the required number of dives is 100+).

The combination of all the above, means that you graduate from the Diploma with a lot of experience underwater that will stand you in good stead when you take your first Instructor role upon completion of the course.

Student Loans Fees Free

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

STUDENT LOANS

A student loan will pay for the course fees.

STUDENT ALLOWANCE

Student Allowances are weekly payments from the Government to help with your living expenses (eg rent, food, petrol) whilst you are studying. You do not need to pay these back.

STUDENT LIVING COSTS

Student Living Costs are weekly payments from the Government to help with your living expenses (eg rent, food, petrol) whilst you are studying. These are part of your student loan and must be paid back.

COURSE RELATED COSTS

You can apply for course related costs up-to \$1,000 (only for eligible full time students) to help pay for items like equipment.

FEES FREE

The NZ Government offers up-to \$12,000 towards your first year of tertiary study. You can find the eligibility criteria and check your fees free status on freesfree.govt.nz

You need your National Student Number to do this. If you do not know your NSN please get in touch and we will be happy to assist.

MEDICAL

You must have a PADI Medical (RSTC) completed and signed by a doctor prior to starting the course. If your intention is to work here in New Zealand when you graduate it is important to know that you will be required to have a certificate of competence (COC) as an occupational diver.

FAQS



Do I need to know how to dive before the course?

No. We will teach you right from the beginning, starting with basic snorkeling, skin diving and scuba skills.

What are the hours?

Full time courses either Mon to Thurs or Tues to Fri each week. Class times are 9:00am to 5:00pm.

Part-Time courses are usually held every other weekend 8:30am to 5:00pm.

How strong a swimmer do I need to be?

Every student must be able to swim 200m or snorkel 300m and float/tread water for 10mins at the start of the course. Professional level divers (Divemaster) and above will need to be relatively competent swimmers.

We have had non-swimmers learn to swim through the year and pass their swim tests when reaching Divemaster.

What equipment must I have?

This depends on the course you are enrolling on. Diploma students are required to own their own full snorkeling package; this must include a suitable wetsuit/drysuit, mask/snorkel/fins, weights and weight belt, gloves/boots, torches, knife etc.

You can use our BCDs, regulators, computers and cylinders at no additional cost for the duration of your course.

Level 3 students need just a few basics; gloves/boots, weights and weight belt, torches, knife etc.

How much does equipment cost?

You can apply for up to \$1000 course related costs to go towards equipment. For the minimum gear required for the Diploma we have packages starting at \$1,400. Excludes weights. Auckland Scuba is fully stocked with great equipment and will give you sound advice at the beginning of your course.

Where do you dive?

Here in Auckland we are lucky enough to be surrounded by marine reserves all along the Harauki gulf. We dive mostly around Leigh (just north of Auckland); sites include Jones Bay, Goat Island, Ti Point, Mathesons Bay, this is not including all the extra trips we do.

What field trips does Auckland Scuba do?

We do five dive trips in the year; Lake Taupo, Rainbow Warrior, HMNZS Canterbury, HMNZS Waikato & The Poor Knights. Transport, accommodation and boat dives are all included.

Is it easy to get a job as a dive instructor?

It's always down to the individual but, there are approximately 5-10 new jobs advertised EVERYDAY on the PADI website alone. These jobs are based in over 180 countries and territories around the world including New Zealand.

Auckland Scuba also has contacts and graduates placed around the globe and offer placement assistance, on request, after you graduate. We will support you in all your efforts to get your dive career going.

Do you dive in winter?

Yes, our Diploma programmes run over 45 weeks starting in February and July each year.

The equipment you will purchase/use from Auckland Scuba, will be suitable for diving in our local environment, throughout the year.

How old must I be?

Diploma/Leadership students must be 18yrs old prior to Divemaster and 16yrs old if applying for loans/allowances

FAQS



Is my qualification valid Worldwide?

Yes PADI is the world's largest diver training organisation and is active in over 180 Countries and territories. PADI divers are certified to dive in areas and under conditions similar to those in which they are trained. Due to NZ diving conditions and the fact we dive all year round. Auckland Scuba trained divers gain experience that will enable them to dive and teach diving in almost any environment in the world.

How many of your graduates are working in the dive industry now?

Auckland Scuba's current success rate for the Diploma Course is 91% employed in the diving industry, after graduating. Most of those had employment within weeks of completing their Diploma. Other graduates and part timers decided to take internships overseas, or went onto to further studies in Marine related disciplines.

How much theory and class work is involved in diving?

This depends on which course you complete. You need to have a good understanding of the theory behind diving to keep yourself and others safe. Most courses have a manual, that you read and then complete knowledge reviews. Once you reach Divemaster (professional level) and above the theory increases. You learn about the physics of diving, physiology, decompression theory and a few other subjects. You are supported in your learning and will be given good time to review your material and complete assignments.


Can I try diving before I apply?

Yes, if you are seriously considering applying to complete a course but would like to make sure you will like diving then call one of our Tertiary Team at Auckland Scuba to arrange a try dive.

What is the advantage of completing the National Qualification instead of just the PADI certifications?

With the National Qualification you obtain many other industry skills, which will aid you in your career in the dive Industry. PADI training alone does not necessarily cover these. You will complete more dives than the PADI courses alone because of field trips and also extra training requirements. You will also do part of the course skills such as compressor use, tank filing, weather interpretation, risk management and creating a dive focused CV, along with many more essential skills. You are 'job ready' at the end of the Diploma course. Our Diving Academy is linked to a fully operational and busy dive centre and its diving community and club. Auckland Scuba's graduates are well respected both here in New Zealand, the Pacific and Overseas.
